

Download Giving Instructions To Draw A Picture Activity

Giving Directions Drawing Activity. Give them each clipboards, paper, and colored pencils or crayons. Then have the pairs sit back-to-back. Tell the pairs that they will each be drawing a picture. The goal of the activity is to make their pictures as similar as possible. Here's your chance to try The Draw My Picture Game. Grab a piece of paper and a pencil and follow the directions below. First, your paper should be situated vertically on your desk. Draw a medium-sized circle in the middle of your paper. Draw a medium-sized square below the circle but have the top of it touch the bottom of the circle. This is a great listening & giving instructions activity. :) Without letting the students see your work, draw and call out instructions for them to copy. Try to make some. Drawing must be as close to what the teacher says. A good way to see improvements in listening skills over time. Simon Says draw.

- Compare the drawing with the original.
- Hand out more pictures and ask participants to swap roles.
- The person with the picture can give instructions in a similar manner as in part 1 but this time the person drawing can ask yes/no questions and the person with the picture can watch as they draw.
