MORE IDEAS TO TRY. Though an anticipation guide works well as pre- and post-reading activity, it can be applied to any learning experience. Use with video or film presentations, guest speakers, or field trips to help focus students' attention on key learning goals. After students are familiar with anticipation guides,...Use the following anticipation guide to preview a story before you read it. Before reading, mark whether or not you agree or disagree with each statement. After reading the story, fill in the page number where you found the answer to each statement, tell whether or not you were right, and reflect on what you found.

Read Write Think Anticipation Guide Quick Write/Quick Draw Quick Write/Quick Draw is a literacy strategy that gives students the opportunity to reflect on their learning. An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic. Before reading, students listen to or read several statements about key concepts presented in the text; they're often structured as a series of statements with which the students can choose to agree or disagree.
